- Plastic bags
- Plastic jugs
- Plastic bottles
- Plastic cups
- Plastic lids
- Plastic wrap & film
- Plastic refill packs
- Chip bags

- Milk, juice, and yogurt cartons
- Flour and sugar bags
- Food packaging made of paper
- Egg cartons
- Wrapping paper



- Metal tubes (caviar tubes)
- Tin cans
- Metal caps and lids
- Aluminum foil and baking trays



- Magazines
- Newspapers
- Weekly magazines
- Flyers
- Office paper
- Pocket books
- Notebooks (leave the spiral in place)



- Coloured glass bottles
- Coloured glass jars



- Clear glass bottles
- Clear glass jars



- Peels from fruit, vegetables, potatoes
- Food scraps
- Meat and fish leftovers
- Coffee grounds with filter
- Tea leaves and tea bags
- Used kitchen paper



- Broken drinking glasses
- Broken porcelain
- Broken mirrors
- Broken ceramics/clay ware



- Regular small batteries
- Button cell batteries



- Incandescent bulbs
- Low-energy bulbs
- Fluorescent tubes (less than 60 cm)



- Mobile phones
- Tablets
- Electronic toys
- Electric toothbrushes



- Diapers, Sanitary pads & tampons, Vacuum cleaner bags, Tobacco (cigarettes, snus), Pet feces, Cat litter, Broken toys, Eggshells, Cotton swabs, Envelopes, Toothbrushes.
